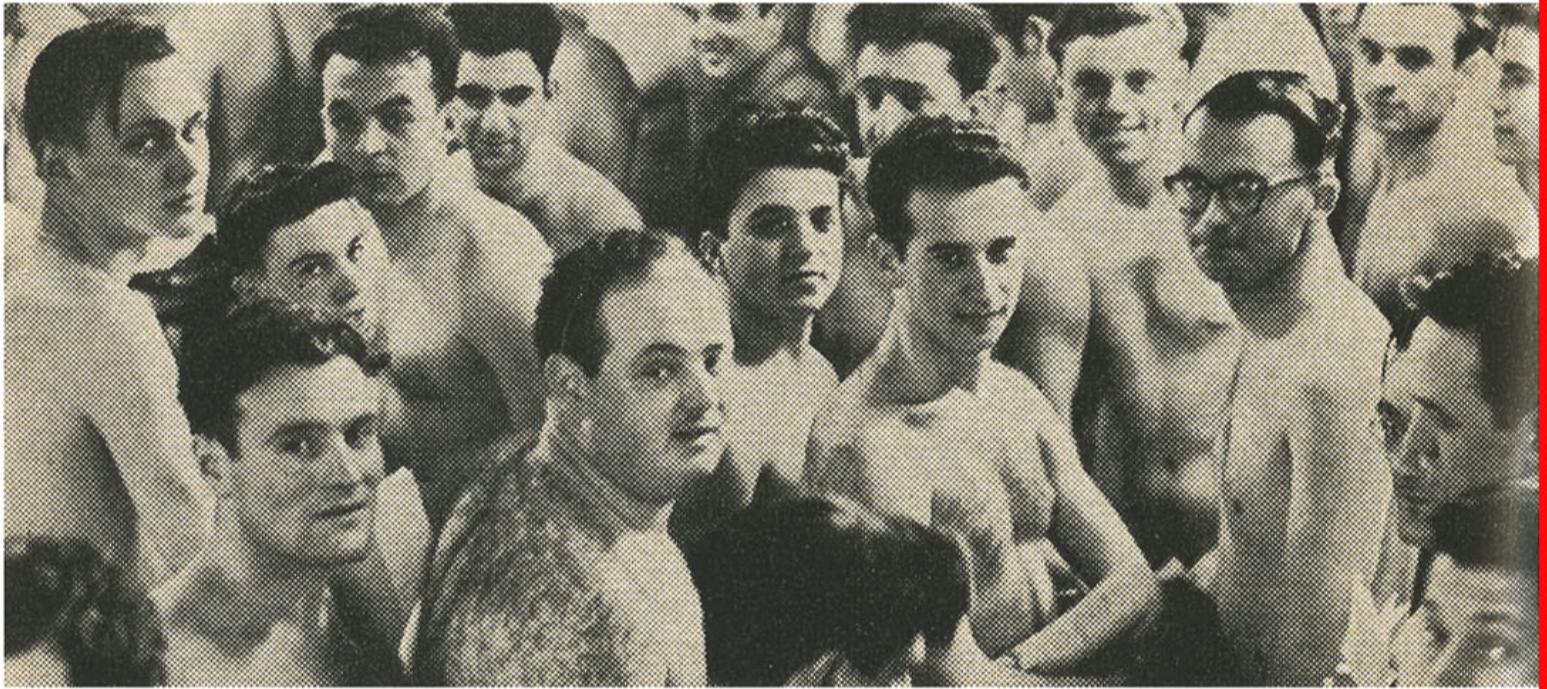

## A Strong Military Reserve Program








Plans to develop a better military reserve for future defense needs won House committee approval. In agreeing to draft boys at 18½ for 26 months of training and service, the House Armed Services group said each man must serve 46 months in the reserves after active duty. Outlook: final action in mid-April.

**Anti-Submarine Fleet:** This chart shows how our Navy is facing up to the challenge of Russia's submarines. A \$2.3 billion ship-building and repair program, just approved by Pres. Truman, will add a 57,800-ton carrier and 172 other new vessels to the fleet. And 291 more are to be demothballed—including 6 carriers, 12 cruisers, 194 destroyers.
