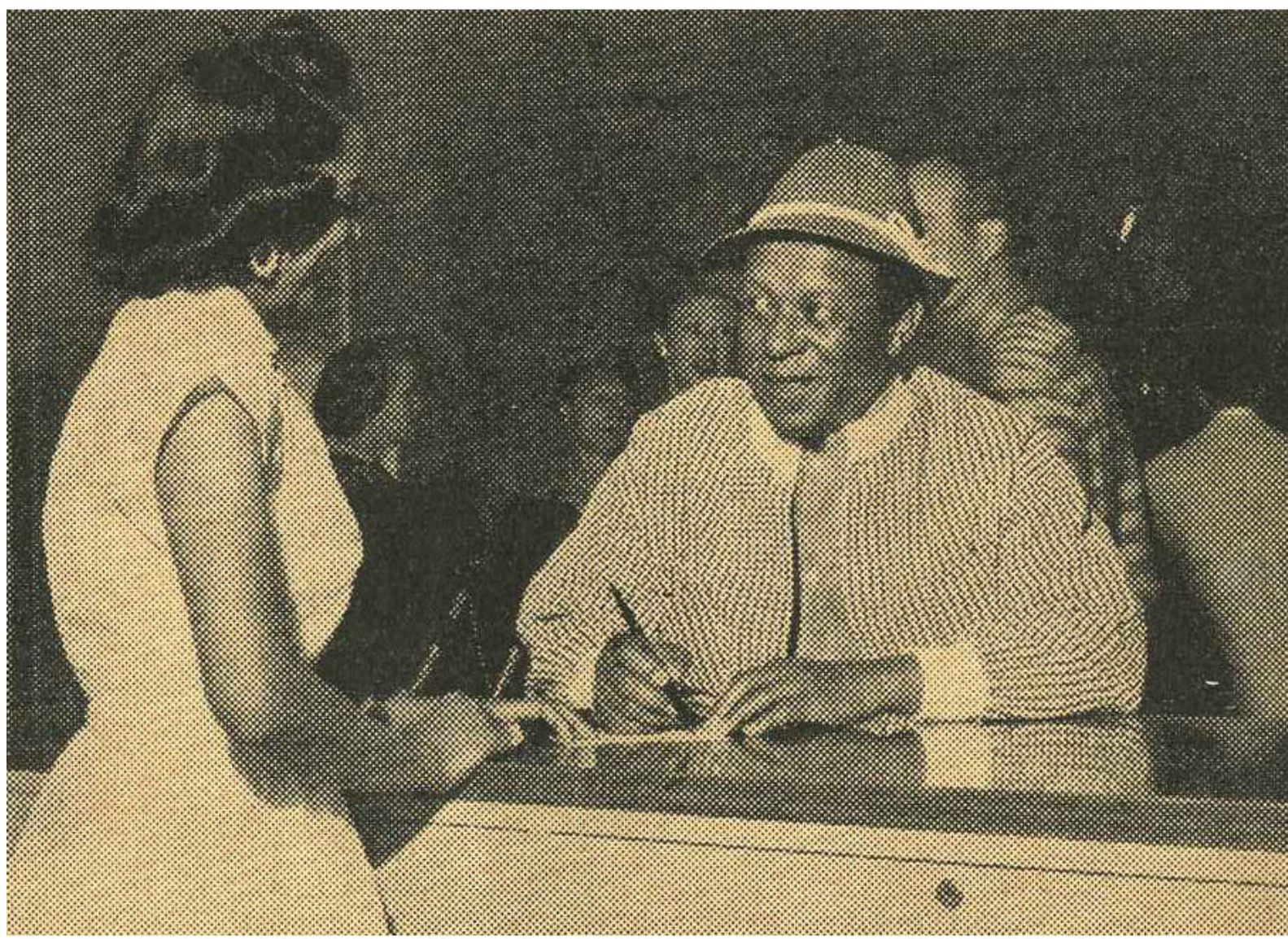


LAS VEGAS GETS AN INTER-RACIAL HOTEL



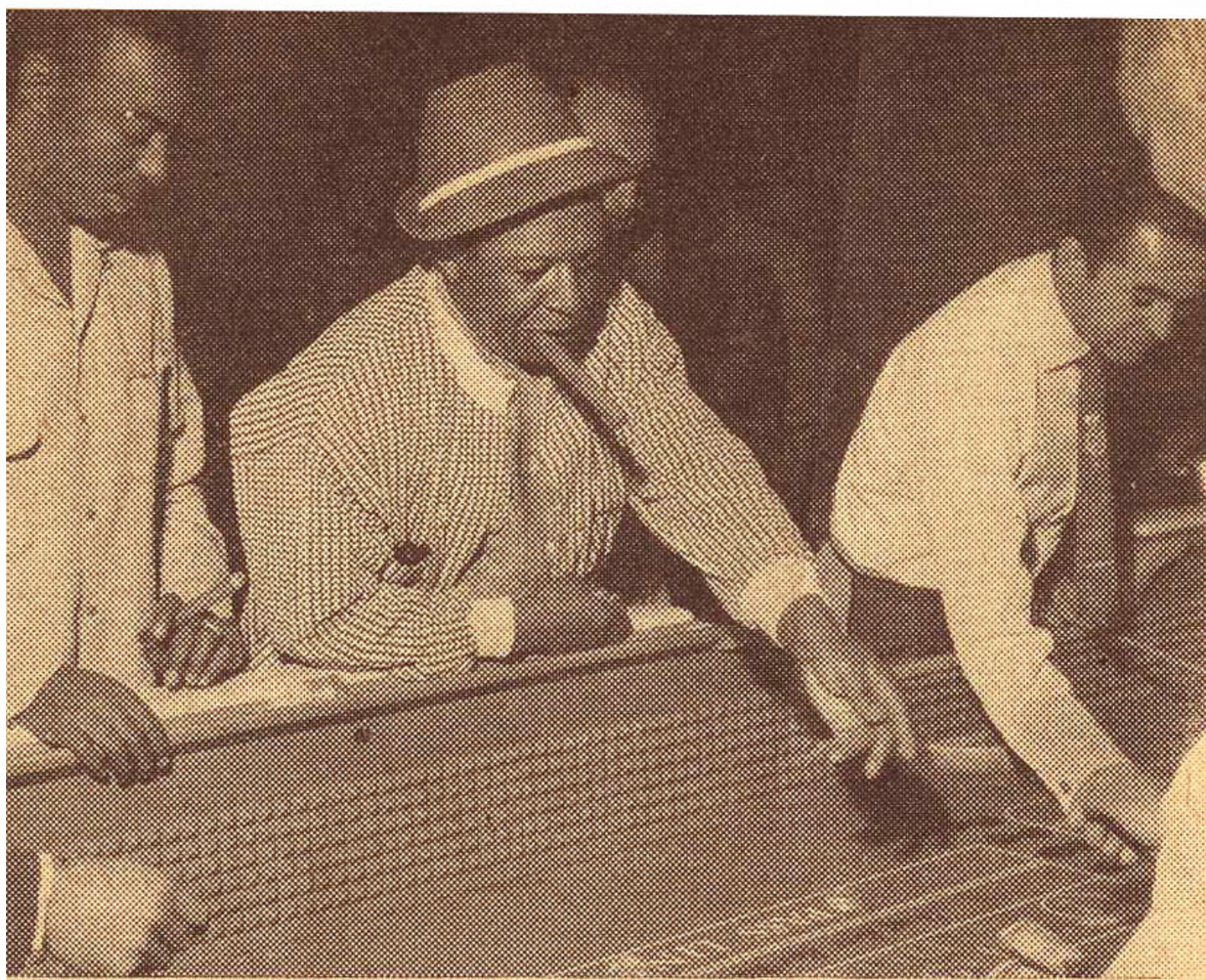

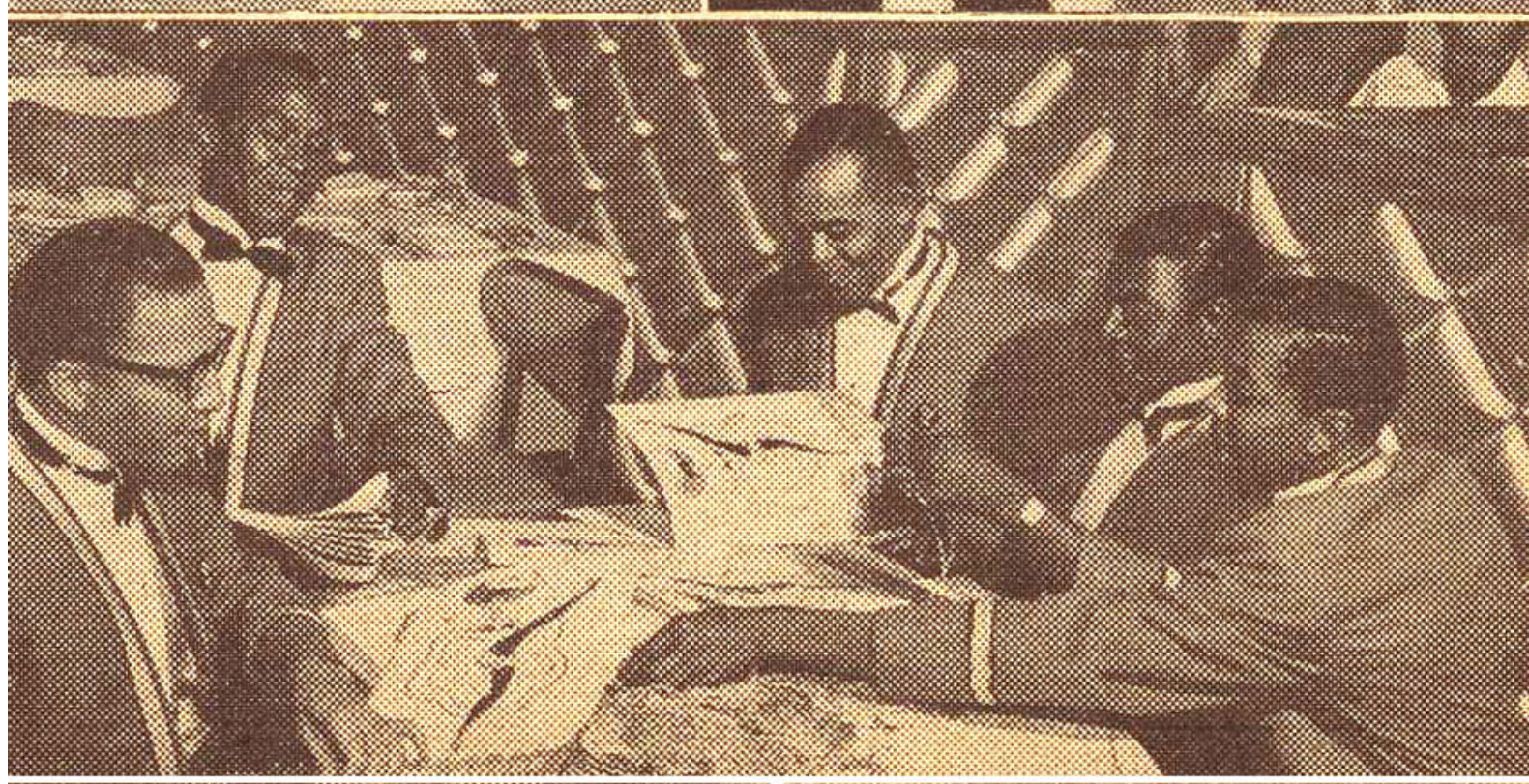
Costing \$3 million, the luxurious desert resort boasts a cocktail lounge, swimming pool and gambling casino. Leading show personali-
