

THE EDUCATION OF GERMAN SCHOOL CHILDREN

ERMAN schoolchildren in Bad Wilsnack as elsewhere look like American kids, study the same arithmetic, discuss the same current events in a regular "press period." But they sneer at democracy and tolerance, deliver serious, bitter, impassioned orations in regular Fuehrer style against liberty and freedom. What kind of education creates a Nazi boy or girl?

Prussian thoroughness in the schools is only one part of the answer. Giving students the National Socialist viewpoint on history, geography and sociology as though there were no other side is another part. Strongest part of the Nazi indoctrination program is the supplement to the schools, the Hitlerjugend-Hitler youth organization. Nearly every German youngster between 10 and 21 belongs—eight million members.

This disciplined army thanks its Fuehrer for a revolutionary creed, a brown-shirt uniform with a Sam Brown belt, a staghandled dirk with a six-inch steel blade, and a chance to put its creed into action. The boys get the excitement of marching on hikes that are virtual military maneuvers, of smashing Jewish store fronts and pummeling dissenters.

The brightest, strongest, most fanatic and most authoritative boys are selected for the Stamm H-J or Elite Corps to be the future leaders of Germany. But despite their work in the labor corps (when they are eighteen) and their eventual chance in Army, Air Corps or the Nazi party, theirs is

not a democratic opportunity. All orders come from Baldur von Schirach, Hitler's plump, aging youth leader. Youth is not youth, but the servant of the State. For a story of education in a democracy
