PERON WELCOMES EUROPE'S POST-WAR DREGS

Argentina, the land of Peron and Evita and the once-proud *La Prensa*, now attracts the world's riffraff—people who butchered millions in W.W.II. Argentina's top guest in this category is Ante Pavelich, Nazi puppet president of Croatia which Hitler carved out of Yugoslavia (from '41-'45). A professional terrorist, Pavelich plotted the murder of King Alexander in Mar-seilles in '34, headed the dreaded *Ustachi* move-ment. In his heyday, his fanatical followers brought him a bucket of human eyes on his birthday. Reportedly he kept the bucket on his desk.
