

Boss of 200,000 enemies



EVERY major American victory simply means more work to Maj. Gen. Allen W. Gullion. As Provost Marshal General, he must not only police and govern conquered Axis territory, but guard the prisoners we capture. Already he has charge of 200,000 prisoners of war scattered in 81 internment camps throughout the U.S. (About 150,000 are German, 50,000 are Italian, and only a handful Jap.) Nazi authorities have expressed satisfaction with Gullion's firm but fair treatment of Germans and have now promised to show more leniency toward our PW's in Germany. This particularly pleases Gullion, because in 1929 he represented America at the Geneva Convention drafting the PW International Code. The General went to France in World War I with the 3d Corps, AEF. He's been called the John Kieran of the Army because of his knowledge of Shakespeare and the Bible. The PW's with Gullion in our photo are Italian.
