SLIDING COLLAR

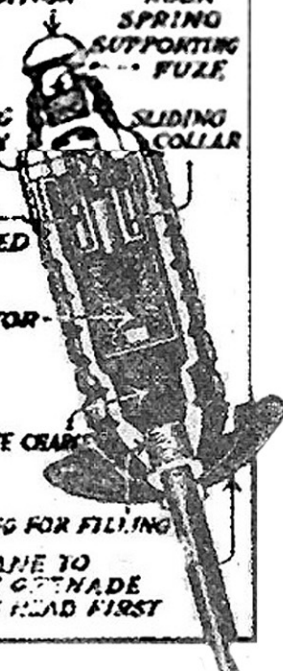
SAFETY SPRING FLATTENED OUT

SAFETY PELLET, SPLIT END OF WHICH ENCLOSES STAR, OFF WHICH IT HOLDS THE STRIKER PELLETS

WITHDRAWING SAFETY PIN TO ALLOW SAFETY PELLET TO BE PULLED OUT

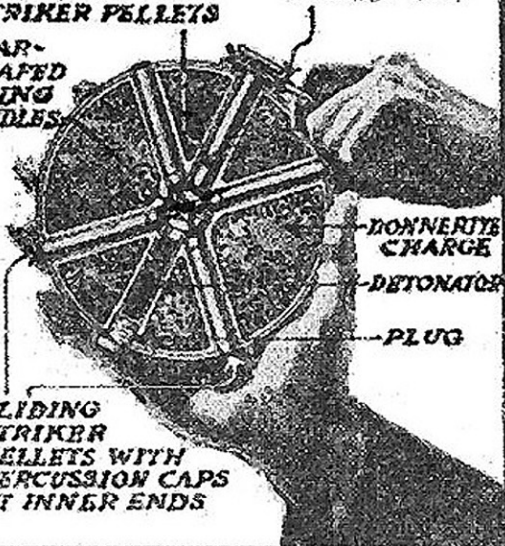
STAR-SHAPED FIRING NEEDLES

SLIDING STRIKER PELLETS WITH PERCUSSION CAPS AT INNER ENDS

CYLINDER READY TO BE READ IN ORDER NOTED

CYLINDRICAL GRENADE FOR THROWING

DETONATOR

① HANDLE SCREWED INTO PLACE

② FUZE BURNS ABOUT 6 SECS BEFORE FIRING DETONATOR

③ DRAG OF IGNITING WIRE IN FRICTION TUBE LIGHTS FUZE

④ PAPER BAND TORN OFF

⑤ LEFT HAND PULLS SHARPLY ON IGNITING WIRE

⑥ RIGHT HAND ABOUT TO HURL GRENADE
