GOLDEN TYPEWRITER BUILT FOR ALFONSO OF SPAIN

Bearing more the appearance of an ornament than a machine built for service, a gold typewriter was recently built for the personal use of King Alfonso of Spain. Nearly every part, even including the smallest screw, is heavily plated with gold, the space bar made of mother-of-pearl, while the royal arms occupy the space ordinarily held by the nameplate. The case is made of mahogany and is inlaid with rare woods and pearl.
