

A BAG, BATSTARD, IS SOST ONE MORE EACOSE FOR



Two shades of orange tan silk combined to form this finely crocheted bag, and, because fashion favours beads for the bags for dress wear, many fine steel beads were worked into the design. The result completely justifies the designer



It is only a bag of beige suède that may acquire so assured a swing; for suède is the material of the moment for daytime bags. This one is mounted in silver and has a monogram of silver and gold on the small suède tab which fastens it, and it lays further claim to smartness by a lining of apricot faille silk


One of bags has a sin in tiny steel paillettes on pire green tag for the chair steel beads for




One of the most modish new bags has a simple design carried out in tiny steel beads and small steel paillettes on a foundation of Empire green taffeta. Silver is used for the chain and mounting, and steel beads form the looped fringe



An artificial pearl fastens a bag that is soft and without framework except for the flexible whalebone concealed in its grey taffeta lining. Of beads of silver glass cross-barred by beads of blue, it was woven by wounded French soldiers





Another example of the work of wounded soldiers is this bag of silver glass beads with blue bead diamonds woven into it. A whalebone—the very slightest of frameworks—hides under the grey taffeta lining, and a single pearl fastens it
