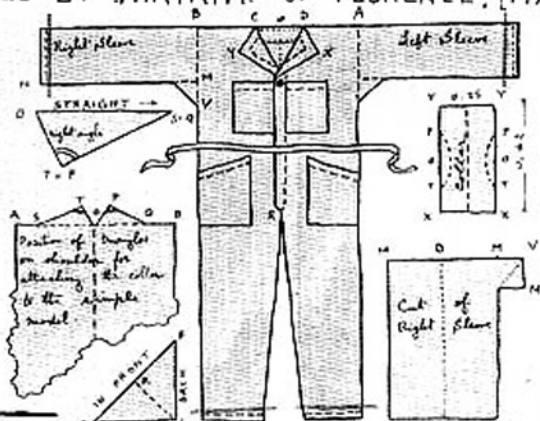


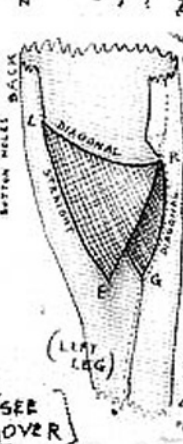
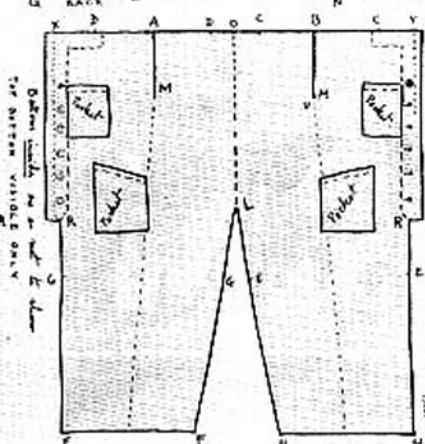

HOW TO CUT OUT THE "TUTA," [ONE PIECE, STRAIGHT LINE GARMENT FOR MEN AND BOYS] DESIGNED BY THAYAHT OF FLORENCE, [ITALY]

This one piece garment is worn with a strip of height reduced stuff at the waist - which narrows and widens. It looks somewhat when worn without belt and often with collar. A simple fabric like blue serge will.



N.B. This might well suit the figure of some men. The arms are already indicated in the measure given here (See point D) which is the measure in construction. - Before cutting the stuff it will break it in water so as to make it stand and also to soften the texture forming it from all stretching. - The TUTA's chief charm is its soft falling line following those of the
