4,765 YANKS WERE TAKEN

Revised records, compiled to eliminate duplicate names, place the total number of American soldiers captured by the enemy at 4,765. Of these, 4,376 have been reported released and 233 dead. The list of 156 names of prisoners whose status is still doubtful is now being checked at the Central Records Office at Bourges.

The record of the Army, Marine and civilian prisoners taken by the Central

Powers as of March 20 follows:

Captured—Army, 4,686; Marines, 79; civilians, 281. Died—Army, 229; Marines, 4; civilians, none. Release recorded—Army, 4,304; Marines, 72; civilians, 116. Status doubtful—Army, 153; Marines, 3; civilians, 165.

A revised report of casualties in the Marine Corps up to and including March 19, shows the total to have been 11,309 officers and men. The major casualties were 38 officers and 2,420 men with 215 missing.
