

German Labor As Reparation

MOSCOW, May 7.—*War and the Working Class*, Moscow publication, asserts that German labor must be used to restore the destruction wrought by the German Army in Europe.

In an article entitled *Labor Reparations*, it contends that using German labor for this purpose will achieve effective military and economic disarmament of Germany. It said that the "time has come to settle accounts."

"The Crimea Conference decided to make Germany repay damage in kind to maximum possible degree," said the dispatch, written by the Soviet author, Alexander Trainin.

"The legal side of the problem is indisputable. The right to demand reparations has become an obligation to make such demand, because any leniency to the aggressor can breed new wars.

"Selections of the form of reparations, whether in money or in kind, is a problem of military and economic advantage. Naturally, Germany must submit all her resources to restore damage."

Trainin asserted that use of German labor for rebuilding Europe would help to disarm Germany economically and to destroy her military potential, but it would not mean the liquidation of her national economy nor would it keep her from participating in world markets.
